Summer is here and with summer heat and rain, we know the grass grows faster than we would like. Please remember to keep your grass and weeds down. The Village Ordinance Code requires residents to keep grass and weeds shorter than 8 inches. This helps reduce risk of fires when the greenery starts to dry out. The Village also wants to remind residents that tall grasses and weeds are the perfect environment for insects like mosquitos to dwell and weeds are an excellent place for several different types of rodents to make a home. If this lush greenery is maintained properly, unwanted pests would be kept minimal.

According to the Village Ordinance 2002-2, residents who do not keep their property well-maintained may receive a notice of violation from the Village Board. Those who receive this notice will have 30 days from the date the notice is received to get the violations corrected. For those who fail to do so, the Village Board will forward the violation to the Night Court unit, and the resident will be responsible for all fines and fees associated with the violation.

The Village Board does not want anyone who is struggling to correct a violation to feel they do not have options. If you are struggling with keeping up with the weeds or grass please contact the Village Office at 217-759-7984 so we can try to assist you. Please call us before it gets out of control which makes it difficult for all involved. Your Village Board is here to help.

within a mile and a half of the Village of Bismarck**

(Those subject to zoning regulations are eligible to participate). PROOF OF RESIDENCY REQUIRED UPON REQUEST.

The Village Board will assess a fee of **\$20 ea** for 1 pickup bed or 1 trailer load to help offset the increasing cost of disposal.

ITEMS ACCEPTED: Large appliances including refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, air-conditioners, freezers, heaters, furnaces, de-humidifiers, rugs, household junk, metal items, etc. Materials that are illegal to burn, such as building materials WILL be accepted.

ABSOLUTELY NO: TVs, computers, electronic devices of any kind such as DVD players or VCRs, paint, household chemical/biohazard materials, yard waste, concrete, garbage or vehicle tires.
(DACC will hold a recycling event this summer for electronics.)

Summer Safety Tips

Grill Safety

- Keep your grill 10 feet away from your home, garage, deck railings, & other structures
- Make sure no flammable items are near the grill
- Check gas lines for leaks
- Only use your grill outside
- Always make sure the lid is open before lighting it
- Never leave a hot grill unattended
- Clean your grill regularly
- Keep a fire extinguisher nearby

Lawnmower Safety

- Pick up toys, rocks, & debris from the yard before mowing
- Keep pets & children indoors
- Wear heavy shoes when mowing, not flip flops or sandals

Pool Safety

- Regularly maintain your pool
- Keep the area around the pool clear & clean
- Install a safety enclosure around the pool
- Add lighting to & around the pool for safe nighttime swimming

Fireworks Safety

- Never point or throw fireworks at another person
- Light fireworks one at a time & quickly move away from them
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose nearby in case of a fire
- Douse the fireworks with plenty of water before discarding them

Driving Safety

- Wear a seat belt
- Make sure children are properly restrained
- Get a thorough vehicle checkup & maintain your vehicle
- Obey the speed limit
- Allow extra time to get to where you need to be during peak traffic hours

Pedestrian Safety

- Walk on the sidewalk & not on the street
- Cross at crosswalks & avoid jaywalking
- Look both ways before crossing the street
- Follow traffic laws
- Wear bright or reflective clothing when walking at night
- Make sure young children are accompanied by an adult
